They would give me the lanterns anyway and figure it all out later. Needless to say, I went back immediately and was so grateful for the kindness. I know my family thinks of me as a "Pollyanna" but I refuse to believe that people are not good on some level and I know that my fellow Woman's Club members certainly are.

INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS Lisa Mills

For almost a year, some VTWC members have enjoyed being international pen pals with women in the town of Chervonohrad, Ukraine, and have learned about the horrors of the war with Russia. On March 15, the Friends of Chervonohrad (FoC) hosted a fundraising concert in Morristown, NJ to support their hometown and raise money for reconstructive eye surgeries for soldiers and training for surgeons and front-line psychologists. FoC has already donated \$150,000 in supplies to the town since the war began three years ago.

The wonderful concert was performed by Two Piano Journey, a mother and son pianist team, who have helped raise more than \$3 million for nonprofits in the hunger relief, education and social service sectors. I attended the concert and made a \$100 donation on behalf of our club, helping the event raise more than \$52,000 for FoC.

Barbara McCloskey, our State President's Grand Initiative is for our clubs to complete a total of 130 Arbor Day or Earth Day Projects. To that end, we will take part in the road cleanup through the Vernon Clean Communities Program. We will meet on Saturday, May 17, 2025, at 10:00 am in front of the Vernon DPW office (across the street from Town Hall). The road we have chosen is Lounsberry Hollow/Sammis Roads.

There is a container outside with the equipment we will need (pickers, safety vests, gloves and a first aid kit). We are expected to return all equipment to the bin neatly after we are finished with our project. Any broken equipment should be reported to me and I will notify Jane Tutolo of the DPW via email, text or phone call as well as any cancellation due to inclement weather.
